Because the extremely large 16 yard entry we had in 1956 (320 shooters, of whom 222 shot the whole 200 target program) could not be comfortably handled in one day on 8 traps it was necessary to either rearrange the program or discontinue the team shoot for this year.

Accordingly we have moved the State Doubles to Friday, kept the State Handicap on Saturday, and split the 200 singles program with the first half shot Saturday and the second half on Sunday. The team shoot will be held on Sunday's 100 targets.

Many other suggestions were studied but this seemed to be the only possible solution and still retain the team shoot. We hope you approve.

Shooters entering the 200 target singles championship will shoot their first 100 Saturday afternoon immediately after the handicap. They will shoot their second 100 Sunday morning with squads remaining the same. Shooting on Sunday will begin at 8:00 a. m. The State Championship, Class Championships, and Ladies Championship are all decided on the 200 targets.

Junior, Veteran, Parent-Child, Husband-Wife and Team Championships are all determined on Sunday's 100 targets only. If any shooter who is eligible for one of these championships shoots the regular 200 target program his second (Sunday's) 100 targets will count for these championships. Sun-juniors will count the first 50 of Sunday's 100 targets for the Sub-junior Championship. Sub-juniors not entering Sunday's program may shoot their 50 targets on the practice-trap at 1 P. M. Sunday. Entry - \$3.00.

ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the WTA will be held immediately after the program on Saturday, July 20, 1957. The terms of two directors are expiring. All registered shooters of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan are eligible to vote and are urged to attend.

SHELLS

You may bring your own shells this year if you wish - either factory or reloads. According to ATA rules all shells are subject to challenge and inspection and if found to be illegal loads the shooter will be disqualified.

Shells will be for sale on the grounds at \$8.50 per 100 for factory loads and \$6.50 per 100 for reloads (based on cost as of May 1, 1957.)

Present your entry card receipt when buying shells as no shells are sold to non-contestants.

No empty shells may be picked up on the grounds.

NOTE

In the event of a dispute over interpretation of any part of this program the decision of the Directors of the WTA shall govern. (They wrote it, they know what they mean.)

Trophies won by anyone who has made application for ATA membership but who has not yet received his card will be withheld until the application is approved.

NOTES ON TEAM SHOOT -

Teams divided into 5 Lewis classes.

Milwaukee Journal trophy to team winning each class.

Members of five teams winning the classes receive individual trophies and \$15.00 per man.

If team members shoot the 200 target program the second 100 (Sunday's program) counts for the team.

TEAM RULES

1. Teams may represent club,s sports stores, taverns, business firms, towns, counties or other organizations.
2. All shooters must be from Wisconsin or Upper Michigan.
3. All team members must live within 12 miles by road of the headquarters of the organization represented - that is, club house, store, main office, post office, courthouse, etc. The burden of proof is on the team member in case of challenge. WTA officials make any necessary rulings on what constitutes the headquarters, etc. Illegal entries disqualify the team and the offending member will be suspended by the WTA. Protests regarding ineligibility must be made within one hour of the time the shooter shoots but before the last shot of the program is fired.
4. The team captain will be held responsible for the eligibility of his team. All awards, payments, etc, will be made to him for the team.
5. The five members of the team must shoot in the same squad. Shooters, once entered, will not be changed from one squad to another for this purpose.
6. Submit team lists on proper blank. Entries made the day of the shoot - no advance entry required.

NOTE: Because those who shoot the whole 200 target program which begins on Saturday, will remain squadded the same for Sunday morning it is most likely that shooters who only shoot Sunday's program will not begin to shoot before noon. From 10 to 12 squads shoot per hour so we should finish early.

NOTES

The WTA includes both Wisconsin, and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Therefore, residents of both are eligible for all trophies and championships specified as for Wisconsin residents only.

The directors of the WTA reserve the right to change the program as conditions warrant and to reject any entry or refund any entry of any contestant without giving reason.

ATA rules will govern this shoot. Entrants not having ATA handicap cards will be classified and handicapped by a committee. Show your ATA SCORE CARD when you register. THIS CARD MUST BE UP TO DATE. Erroneous cards submitted will result in disbarment from the shoot, forfeiture of trophies, etc., and will be reported to the ATA and to all clubs affiliated with the WTA.

The classification Committee consists of Ed. Hanson chairman, Dave Huulgaard, G. S. Kellenbenz, Jeff Whitehill and Dennis Blackman. They will continue to apply known ability and common sense as they have done the past several years. We are proud of their record of fair classification and refer you to the payoff sheets for proof.

No protests on classification or handicap will be entertained by the Committee unless submitted in writing.

NO SCORES CHANGED AFTER THE SHOOTER HAS FIRED AT FIVE SUCCEEDING TARGETS. THIS IS AN ATA RULE.

Ties shot off the same day or as the directors rule. Absentees when shoot-offs are called forfeit. Singles shot off on 25 targets; doubles on ten pair. Some ties, where specified, are decided by reverse score.

Practice trap available each day all day. Buy practice ticket at shell house. Tickets are numbered and will be called in order. \$3.15 per round. Targets only \$1.00.

Entries for following day's events will only be taken at hours specified. This is done to lighten the duties of the classification committee a bit. They have been doing a good job and we do not want to kill them off for next year.

In all events in which trophies are given for ladies, juniors or sub-juniors, such a shooter whose score would win both that trophy and another trophy will be given a choice between the trophies won but cannot take more than one. Such choice will be made after ties have been settled.

OPERATION of the WISCONSIN STATE SHOOT

For many years the Wisconsin state shoot has been handled in this way: The club awarded the shoot is paid according to targets thrown. The club also operates the first day of the shoot and the practice trap. They furnish all comforts, etc., for the shooters. The WTA has complete management of the last two days of the shoot and pays all help, prizes, supplies, etc., for it. We think the system is successful and it avoids certain bad features. We recommend it to other states.

Rule change this year: If part of the shot or wads stay in the barrel you get another shot.

NOTES

Remember — If you are going to the Grand—you need 500 16-yard registered targets or you get Class A. And if you do not have 600 registered handicap and 200 16 yd. targets you get 22 yards. If you do not have 350 doubles you get class B.

The Lundington Cup will be in competition this year. Entrance — \$1.00 in the cup. Last year's winner, Vic Reinders, receives entry money. Non-residents eligible but may not take cup from state. Shot on the first 50 targets of state 16-yard championship. Ties shot off on succeeding events.

Make your complete entry for any one event at one time. No "string bets" or partial withdrawals. of optionals, etc., allowed.

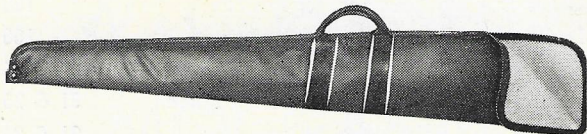
